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CALL FOR PAPERS FURTHER EXTENDED

The Botswana Open University (BOU) is organising an International Conference on Open and Distance Learning. This will be held at the Avani Hotel in Gaborone. from 8-10 May 2024. Participants are invited to submit abstracts and papers for presentation at the conference.

Conference Venue

The Conference will be held at Avani Hotel Gaborone

Conference rationale

For over a century, open and distance learning (ODL), or its more widely used term, distance education, has become a way of promoting educational access worldwide. The field has witnessed an upsurge in technological innovations, the growth of Open Universities and Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs), the emergence of online learning, and a growth in mobile learning, among others. While COVID-19 has boosted ODL use globally, the post-COVID era is inundated with stories of technological advancements, emergence of artificial intelligence (AI) and its ethical implications and the use of open educational resources (OER).

Between access provisions and quality calls, National and Transnational Qualification Frameworks have emerged, to enhance quality of instruction through proper monitoring, and ensure transfer of credits across borders and boundaries, and across programmes and practices. Technological policies have been established by many nations, Africa inclusive, to enable access to online learning platforms. Assessment strategies in teaching are leaning towards alternative pathways, just as research is growing within the discipline. Generally, there is a desire to promote innovations in teaching and learning.

Against this background, this conference brings together thought leaders and academics and others in tertiary and vocational education, to share ideas on developments in ODL. It aims to showcase innovative practices in teaching and learning, share best and alternative practices in assessment, and provide actionable insight on technology adoption and management, research and innovation, partnership and collaboration, and support service provisions in the field.



Viable support systems for e-learning; Strategies for enhancing learner support; Managing tutorial services and activities; Innovative practices in libraries and information services; Counselling and e-counselling support; Capacity building and human resource development; and Marketing learning programmes to students.



FINANCING OF ODL

Expenditure patterns and cost drivers in ODL; Budgeting and forecasting resource needs; Innovative sources of funding for open universities; Financial management and cost containment strategies; Mobilising for resources in ODL; Competing for funding of ODL; Research and scholarship in ODL Financing.

Outcome of the conference

Following the conference, a selected number of papers will be published in a special book.

Submission of abstracts

Abstracts should be submitted by the 15th March 2024.

Submit an abstract of not more 350 words, indicating the title, focus of presentation, research methods and key findings. Each abstract should identify a topic and the conference sub-theme. They should also include a list of key words at the end.

Abstracts should be sent to this email: boubiennialconference@bou.ac.bw. Notification of abstract peer review/acceptance is from the 15th March 2024.

Guidelines for conference papers

Final papers for presentation should be written in Times New Roman 12pt font, 1.5 line-spacing and justified margins. Each paper should include the title page (title, author – name/s and organisation), an abstract with five keywords, the main body, conclusion, and references. Each paper should be between 10 and 15 pages.

Guidelines for manuscripts

A book will be published following the conference, based on selected high-quality papers chosen from the papers presented. Conference participants should submit their final papers by the 30th of May 2024 for peer review. The length of the paper should be between 4500-6000 words. Further publication details will be provided later.



Conference mode

The conference will be both in-person and online (hybrid).
